Black theology, or black liberation theology, refers to a theological perspective which originated among African-American seminarians and scholars, and in some black churches in the United States and later in other parts of the world. It contextualizes Christianity in an attempt to help those of African descent overcome oppression.

Its goal is to apply the Christian worldview to aid the poor, especially those of African-American descent, and liberate them from social, political, economic, or religious hardships.

Black Liberation Theology - What is it?

Black Liberation Theology is Martin Luther King Jr.'s social gospel and Malcolm X's Black Nationalism in one. Black Liberation Theology exchanges the power of God for Black power. It exchanges the supremacy of Christ for Black supremacy. Black Liberation Theology is built on a foundation of bitterness and victimhood, with social justice as its chief cornerstone. In James Cone's theology, Black liberation from White oppression is the gospel.

Black Liberation Theology and Woke Christianity

Western European theology serves the oppressors; therefore theology for African-Americans should validate their struggle for liberation and justice. In seven brief chapters, he argues passionately that God must be on the side of oppressed black people and develops the concept of a black God, noting: "To say God is Creator means..."

Black liberation theology shares much in common with liberation theology in general but also has its own uniqueness. As a theology of liberation, it is concerned with the political and economic aspects of salvation rather than salvation in spiritual terms. Moreover, God is viewed as being primarily for the poor over against the rich in society.

The overall emphasis of black liberation theology is the black struggle for liberation from various forms of "white racism" and oppression. James Cone, the chief architect of black liberation theology in his book A Black Theology of Liberation (1970), develops black theology as a system.
