Capital Budgeting Analysis - The Overall Process

Capital budgeting can be simply defined as the process in which a business determines whether projects are worth pursuing (Byrd, Hickman, & McPherson, 2013). The three most used methods of capital budgeting are net present value (NPV), internal rate of return (IRR), and the payback method (Byrd, et.al, 2013).
