The iconic Texas horned lizard (*Phrynosoma cornutum*) is the state reptile of Texas and was once abundant throughout a large range. They prefer arid to semi-arid areas with sparse plant cover and loose sand or loamy soils; their diet consists mostly of native harvester ants and other insects.

Symbol. The genus of horned lizards is the official state reptile of Wyoming. Texas designated the Texas horned lizard (*Phrynosoma cornutum*) as the official state reptile in 1993 and the "TCU Horned Frog" is the mascot of Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas.TCU is the only known athletic team with the horned lizard as a mascot.

The Texas horned lizard (*Phrynosoma cornutum*) is one of about 14 North American species of spikey-bodied reptiles called horned lizards, all belonging to the genus *Phrynosoma*. *P. cornutum* ranges from Colorado and Kansas to northern Mexico (in the Sonoran desert), and from southeastern Arizona to Texas. Also, isolated introduced populations are found in the Carolinas, Georgia, and Florida.
