Only burn seasoned, dry wood, which burns hotter and cleaner. Use a moisture meter to check firewood; moisture content is best at about 20 percent. Cover stacked wood, but allow good air flow so it can dry. Never burn wood during air quality alert days, when air pollution is already higher.

The fire pit can be no closer than 15 feet to any structure, combustible material, property line, deck, etc. Only firewood, limbs, and wood chips may be burned in the fire pit. The fire pit can be no larger than 36 inches in diameter. The flames can be no higher than 2 feet.

Campfires, Bonfires, Fire Pits, Chimineas and Other Similar Devices. The burning of wood in a campfire, bonfire, chiminea or other similar devices is prohibited if the burning is conducted so that it creates a nuisance for neighbors or it is in violation of any restrictions imposed on such burning by your local municipality.

Open burning is allowed from mid winter to early spring across most of Massachusetts. It is prohibited in 22 densely built and populated cities and towns. See below for a list. If open burning is allowed in your community, contact your local fire department to obtain an open burning permit in advance.

All fire pits must be located a minimum 25 feet from any structure or combustible material and you must have fire extinguishing materials (water, dirt, sand, etc.) available. Do I have to supervise the fire? A responsible adult must constantly attend and supervise the fire until it has been completely extinguished.

Wetter wood will burn slower, but you don't want it too wet or it won't catch fire. Wet wood will smoke way more than dry wood. If you have extra firewood, keep it stacked upwind of your fire, so that a sudden breeze won't light all the rest of your wood on fire. Keep the fire small so it stays under control.

For conditionally allowed private residential, commercial, or industrial property burning of dead and dry weeds, burn hours are from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. There are no time restrictions on permanently installed outdoor

fireplaces, barbeque pits, and portable fireplaces or chimineas.

Outdoor Open Burning — City of Albuquerque

The 2008 California Fire Code Section 308 restricts the use of open-flame cooking devices and charcoal fires to balconies protected by automatic water sprinklers and to balconies of one- and two-family homes. Liquid propane gas grills are exempt from this restriction.

What Are the Regulations for Outside Fire Pits in ...

Apartment Buildings may require twenty five (25) feet. Fire Pits cannot be used during "Air Quality Alert" days. Any other "Open Burning" (trash, brush, etc) must be approved by the Division of Fire, Fire Prevention Bureau and must have a permit. If there are ANY complaints from neighbors, immediate extinguishment must be done.

Fire Pits - Columbus, Ohio

Even though portable fire pits and chimineas are fashionable and widely offered for sale in garden centers and home stores, open burning of wood (or any products other than propane, natural gas, or charcoal briquettes) is outlawed in Denver without permits from the Denver Department of Environmental Health and the Fire Prevention and Investigation Division.

The purpose of these rules and regulations is to clarify and interpret the exception to the general prohibition on open burning that allows "the burning of fuels for legitimate campfire, recreational and cooking purposes," unless such activities cause air pollution, as provided in 35 IAC Sec. 237.120(e) and incorporated by reference in Section 1 1-4-740 of the Code, with the intention of protecting people from air pollution. 2.0 Legitimate Campfire, Recreational, and Cooking Activities.

City of Chicago

The fire pit should be sited on a flat surface that is non-combustible. An area should be cleared around it 15 feet in all directions of all vegetation and combustibles. The fire pit MUST be 30 feet from any habitable structure. If using a manufactured fire pit, it is to be placed on a flat and level surface, on the ground.

Fire Pit Policy | Falmouth, MA

A recreational fire is limited to a pile size of 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet high. A recreational fire does not require a permit, but anything larger requires an open burn permit (bonfire or agricultural burn). A recreational fire pit must be at least 25 feet from a structure or combustible material.
