The difference between Yarn and Thread is. • Yarn: It is a continuous twisted strand of wool, cotton or synthetic fibre used for Knitting or weaving purpose. • Thread: It is a fine cord made up of two or more twisted fibres used in sewing and weaving.

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Fibers Textile Fiber: the basic unit from which textile products are made. Natural Fibers Found in nature in fibrous form. Cellulose and protein are the two categories for natural fibers. Cellulose = obtained from plant sources. Protein = obtained from animal sources. Manufactured Fibers Produced either from raw materials found in nature, or synthesized from chemicals.
